
TYPES OF FUNDS

DONOR ADVISED FUND

EXAMPLE: Jake & Mary Meyer Fund

Donor Advised Funds are for individuals and families who want to support causes that are meaningful to them, while seeking active involvement in choosing their grant recipients. These funds offer a tax benefit while allowing donors to make grants over time to a variety of their favorite nonprofit organizations.

DESIGNATED FUND

EXAMPLE: James & Gloria Straub Pinecrest Activities Department Fund

Designated funds allow you to direct your gift to a specific agency or purpose. Almost any 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization may be designated to receive support for its mission. You identify the recipient(s) you wish to benefit through your gift and our staff manages the annual distribution of funds from the endowment.

UNRESTRICTED FUND

EXAMPLE: ELK COUNTY DEVELOPMENT FUND

This unrestricted fund is a general fund that allows the flexibility to address your community's changing needs through strategic grant making each year. Rather than designating how the money will be spent, you allow the Foundation to determine the most effective ways to meet our community's most pressing needs. Annually, our unrestricted fund awards thousands of dollars in grants to nonprofit organizations.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

EXAMPLE: THE CARIBARDI FAMILY FUND

Individuals, families, companies, and organizations establish scholarship funds to allow students to pursue academic goals. Working with the Foundation, you determine the criteria for your scholarship such as level of education (preschool to postgraduation), a field of study, and other eligibility requirements.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUND EXAMPLE: RIDGWAY YMCA ENDOWMENT FUND

An Agency Endowment Fund is usually created by the organization itself for the express purpose of providing a source of permanent, ongoing support to a specific nonprofit organization. The endowments are usually open-ended so that once they are established other donors may contribute to the fund. An agency endowment is a perfect vehicle to accept charitable bequests.
